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About this Report::

This report summarizes fall enrollment for Wayne State University. This report uses the Registrar's enrollment data as the fall census date.

Definitions

Credit Hour—A credit hour is defined as one class hour per week or its equivalent.

First Time in Any College (FTIAC) - A full- time or part- time student attending any institution for the first time. Includes students enrolled in the fall term who attended a postsecondary institution for the first time at the same level in the prior summer term. Also includes students who entered with advanced standing (college credit earned before graduation from high school).

Full Time Student (Fall/Winter Semester): A student at the following level must be enrolled in the following amount of credit hours per term, regardless of the level of the course: Undergraduate, 12 or more credit hours; Graduate, 8 or more credit hours; Professional (excluding Medical students), 10 or more credit hours; Medical 24 or more credit hours (per Medical year).

Full Time Equivalent (FTE) Students (using fall student headcounts): The number of FTE students is a calculation based on fall student headcounts as reported to IPEDS. The FTE for part time students is calculated by multiplying the part time headcount by a factor determined by student level and added to the full time student headcount to achieve a full time equivalent headcount.

Graduate Student—A student who holds a bachelor's or first professional degree, or equivalent, and is enrolled in a graduate program.

Headcount (Enrollment)—Number of students enrolled at the institution as of census date of the term, the tenth day of classes. Each student equals one headcount, regardless of the credit hours taken.

Non-Resident Student—A student with a legal residence outside of Michigan.

Professional student-- A student enrolled in either the Medical Doctor program, Doctor of Pharmacy program, or Juris Doctor program.

Resident Student—A student having a legal residence in Michigan.

Transfer Student—A student entering the reporting institution for the first time but known to have previously attended a postsecondary institution at the same level, e.g. undergraduate, graduate and has earned credit at that institution.

Undergraduate student—A student enrolled in a bachelor's degree program or post-bachelor certificate program; includes non-degree-seeking students who do not have a bachelor's degree.

Executive Summary of Changes From Fall 2009 to Fall 2010

- Headcount enrollment change
 - Total headcount decreased by 281 students (-0.9%).
 - Undergraduate headcount increased by 72 students (0.3%).
 - Graduate level headcount decreased by 360 students (-4.1%).
 - Professional level headcount increased by 7 students (0.3%).
- Credit hour enrollment change
 - Total credit hours increased by 788 credits (0.2%).
 - Undergraduate credit hours increased by 1,993 credits (0.9%).
 - Graduate level credit hours decreased by 1,791 credits (-3.1%).
 - Professional level credit hours increased by 586 credits (1.4%).
- First Time in Any College (FTIAC) undergraduate headcount decreased by 363 (-11.9%) students and 4,236 (-10.8%) credit hours.
- Transfer undergraduate enrollment headcount grew by 11 (0.6%) but dropped in credit hours by 39 (-0.2%).
- Minority total enrollment headcount decreased 281 (-1.8%).
- Total international enrollment headcount declined by 112 students (-6.2%).
- The average ACT composite score and average high school grade point average of incoming FTIAC's improved to 20.9 and 3.17 respectively, up from 20.5 and 3.12.
- The full-time FTIAC (degree-seeking) one year retention (freshman returning a second year) rate increased for the third consecutive year.
- The four-year graduation rate increased from 9.7% to 10.1%.
- The five-year graduation rate decreased from 23.6% to 19.7%.
- The six-year graduation rate decreased from 31.7% to 30.9%.

Total Fall Enrollment

The fall 2010 total enrollment headcount decreased slightly from the fall 2009 count of 31,787. This represents a decline of 0.9 percent. Total credit hours increased by 788 or 0.2 percent. The School of Social Work was the only school/college to increase headcount and credit hours at every level.

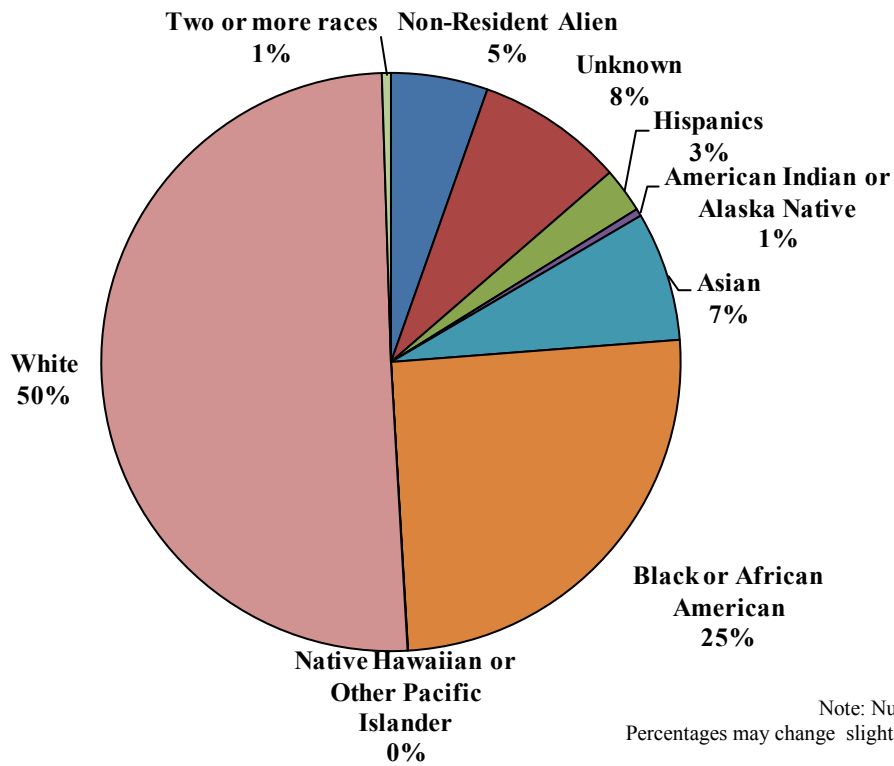
Over 80 percent of WSU's students came from the Wayne, Oakland and Macomb county areas; 91 percent of Wayne State students were Michigan residents. Since 2006, the demographic for student residency has remained around 90 percent for Michigan residents. During the same period, domestic non-resident enrollment has grown considerably (87.4%) but international enrollment has decreased by over a third (-36.4%).

The percentage of students that are full-time versus part-time has increased 6 percent points in the past five years with the majority taking 12 or more credit hours per semester.

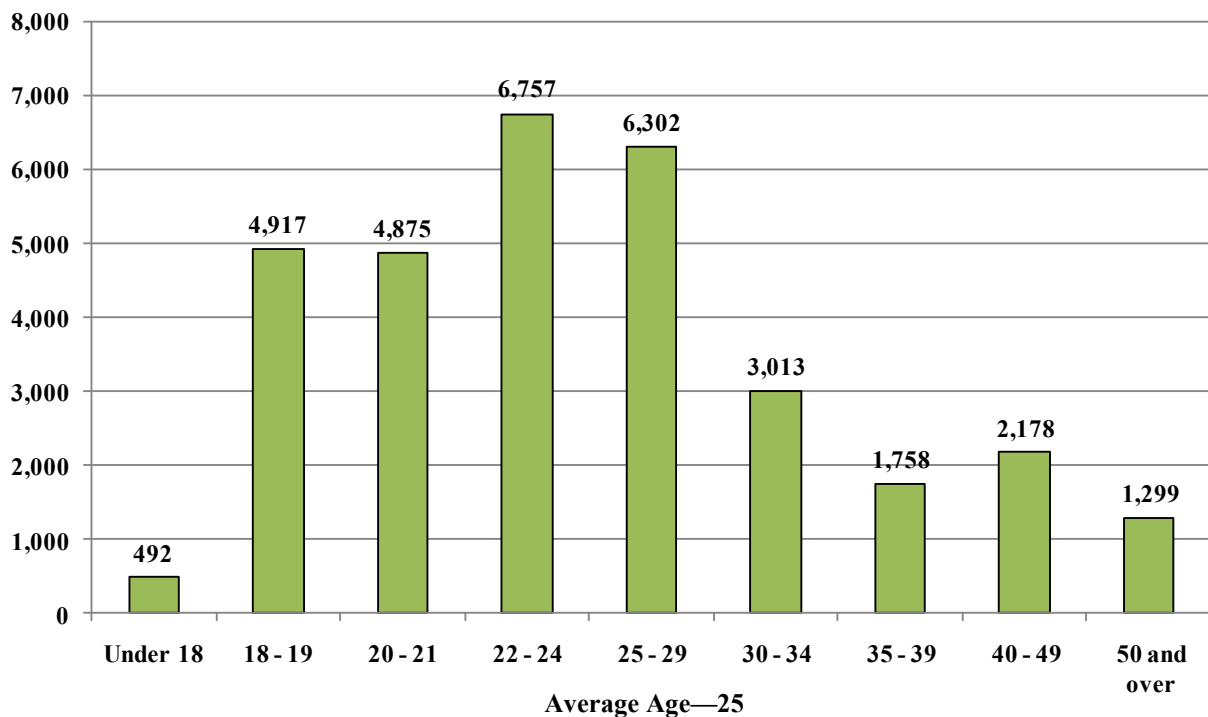

Fall 2010 Total Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity

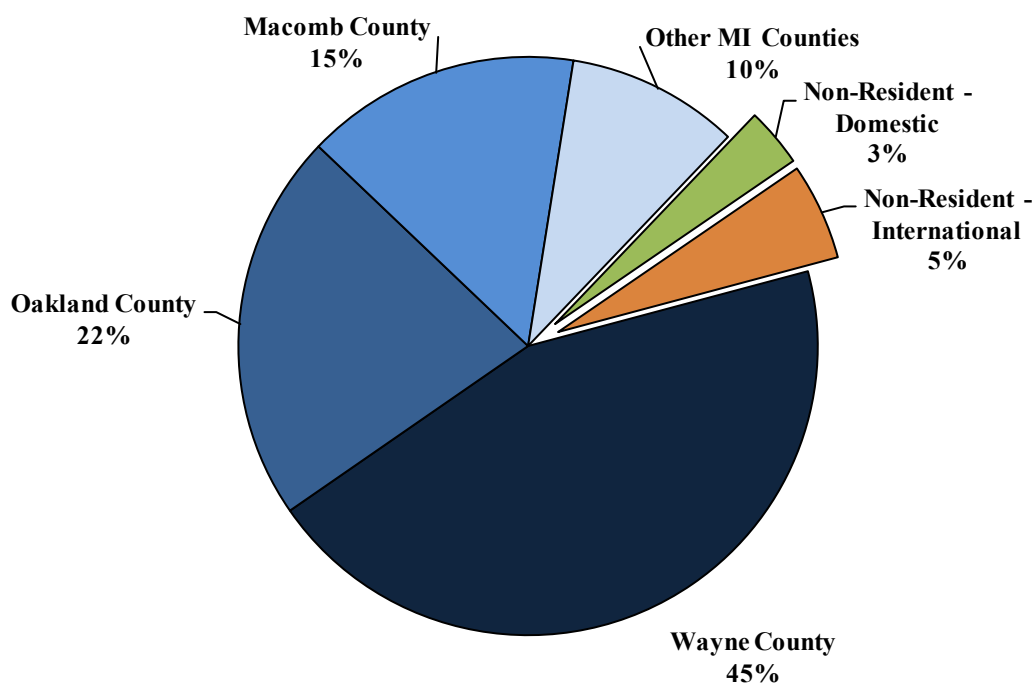

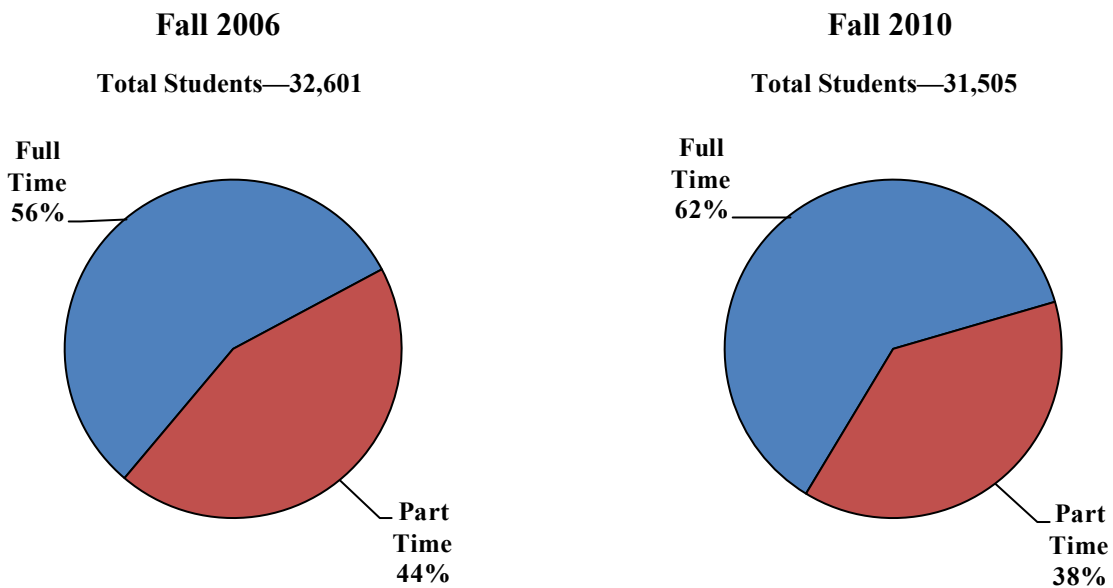

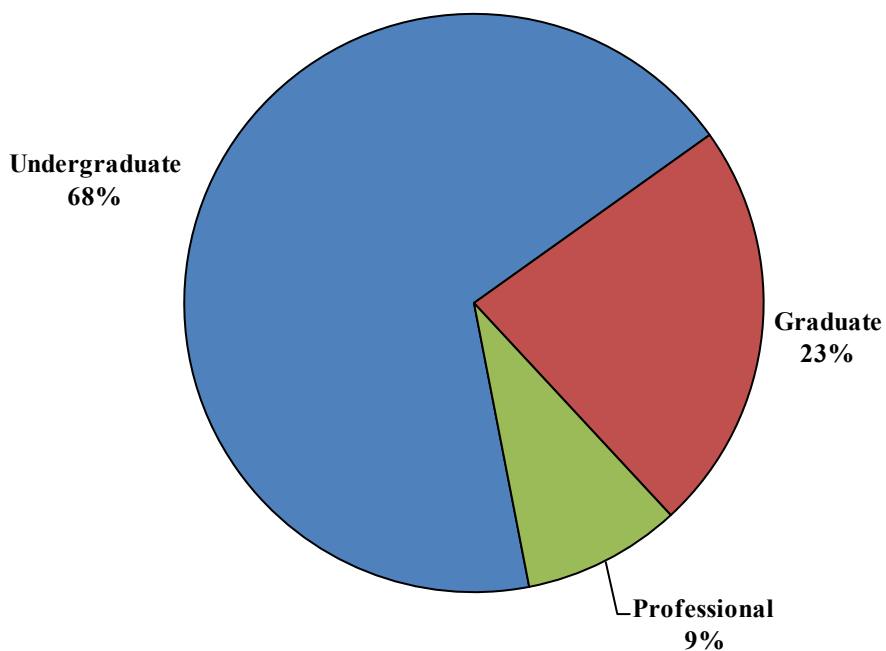

Undergraduate Fall Enrollment

The undergraduate fall enrollment headcount and credit hour totals grew slightly since fall 2009 while absorbing an 11.9 percent decrease in FTIAC enrollments and a 10.8 percent decrease in credit hours.

The fall 2010 average undergraduate credit hour load was eleven credit hours. Of the incoming freshmen, 92 percent are full-time students.

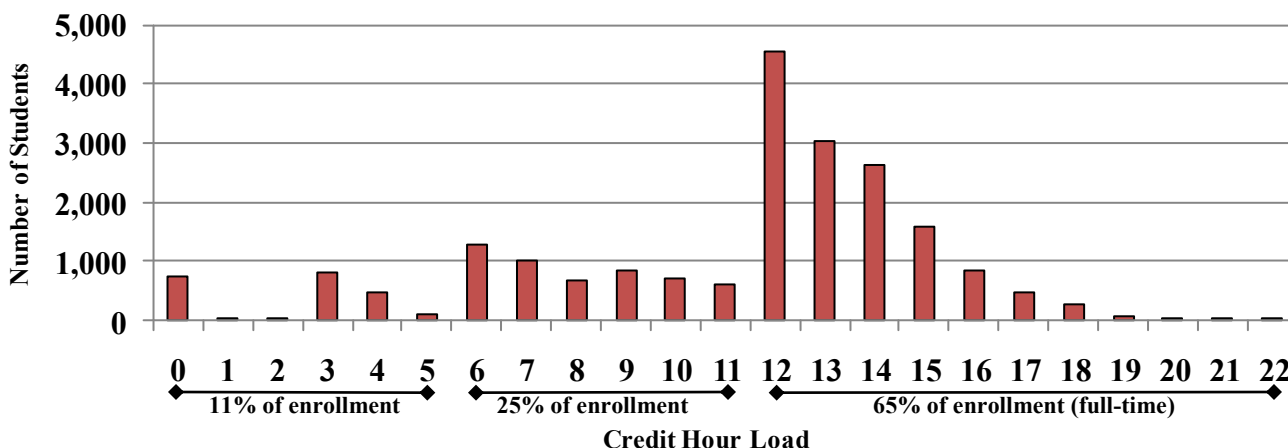

The university's retention rate of full-time freshman to sophomore students increased 12 percent over the past five years.

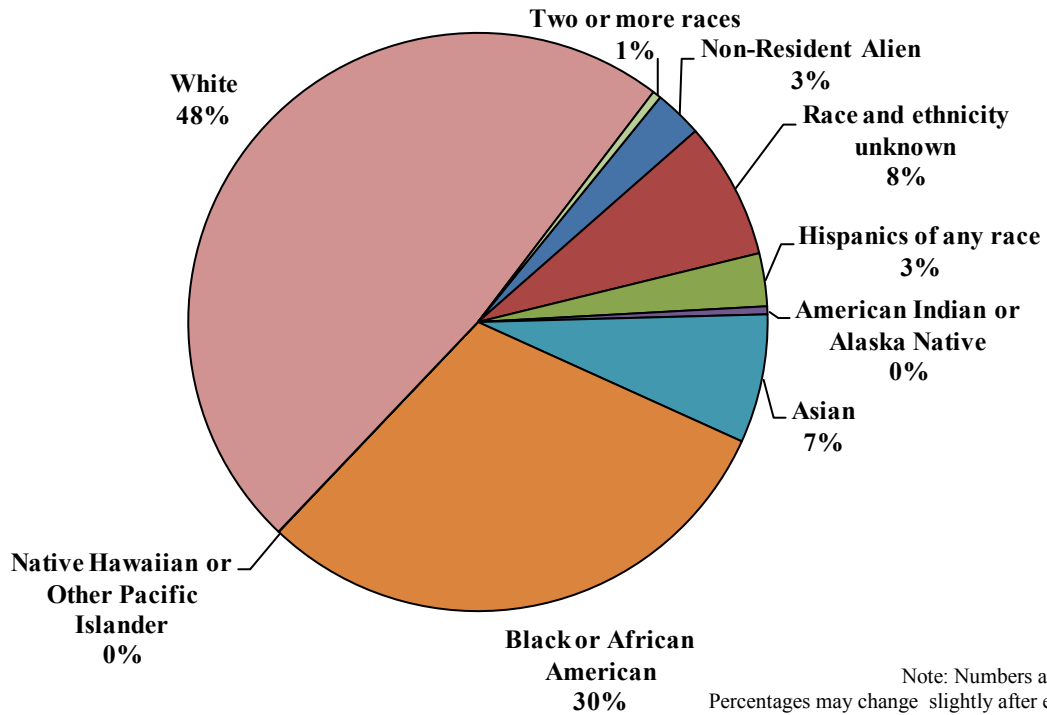

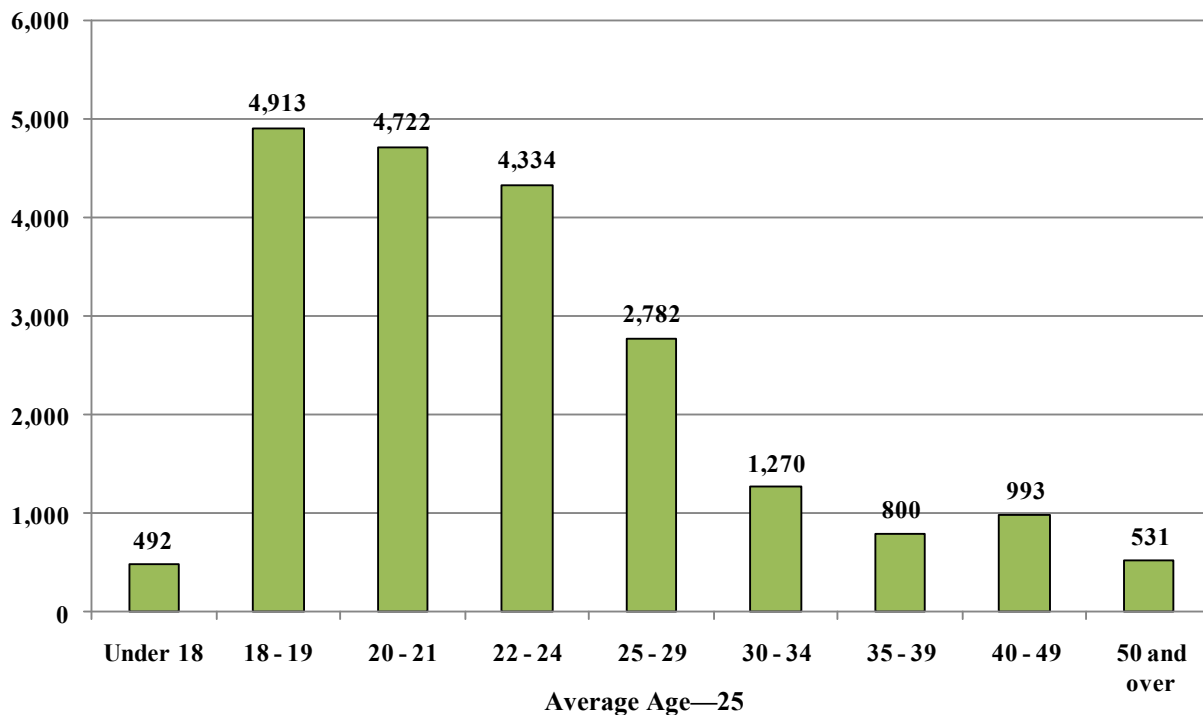
Fall 2010 Undergraduate Student Credit Hour Load Distribution



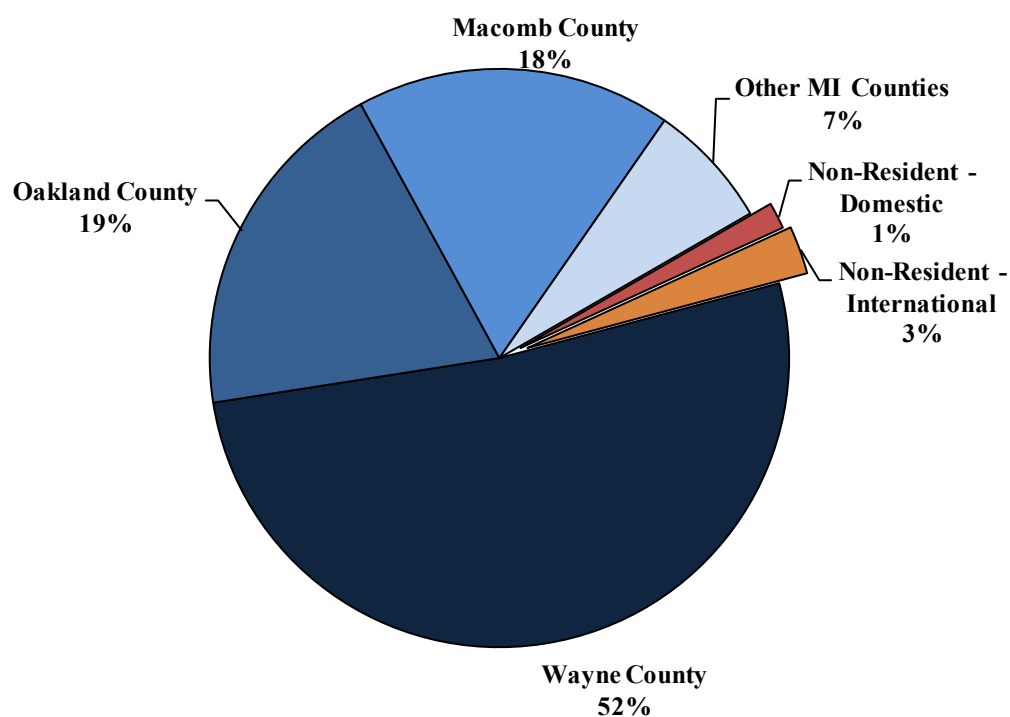
Fall 2010 Undergraduate Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity

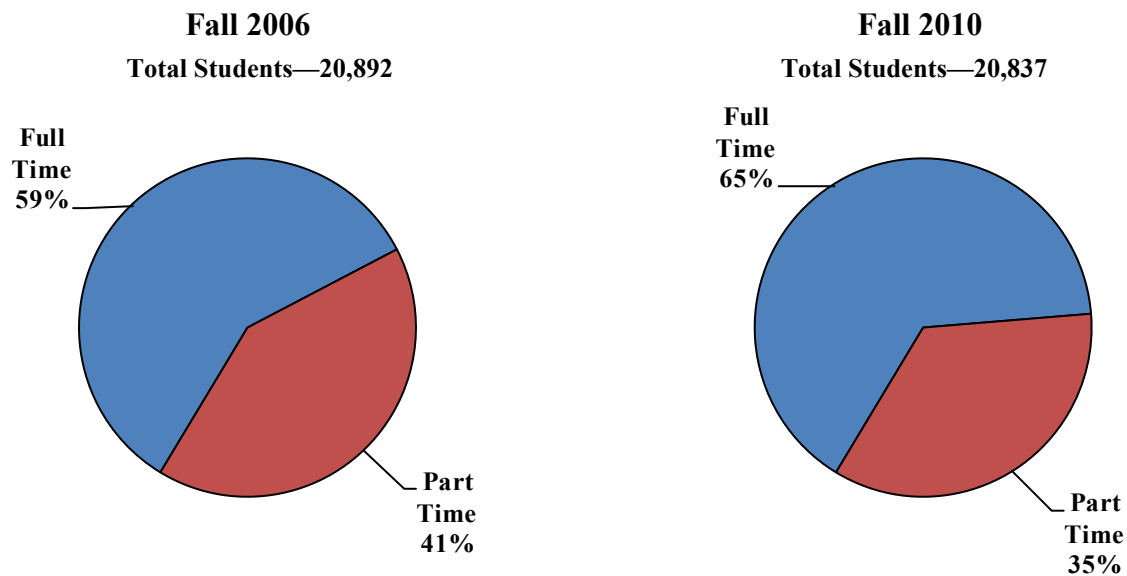

Fall Undergraduate Enrollment by Time Status Comparison



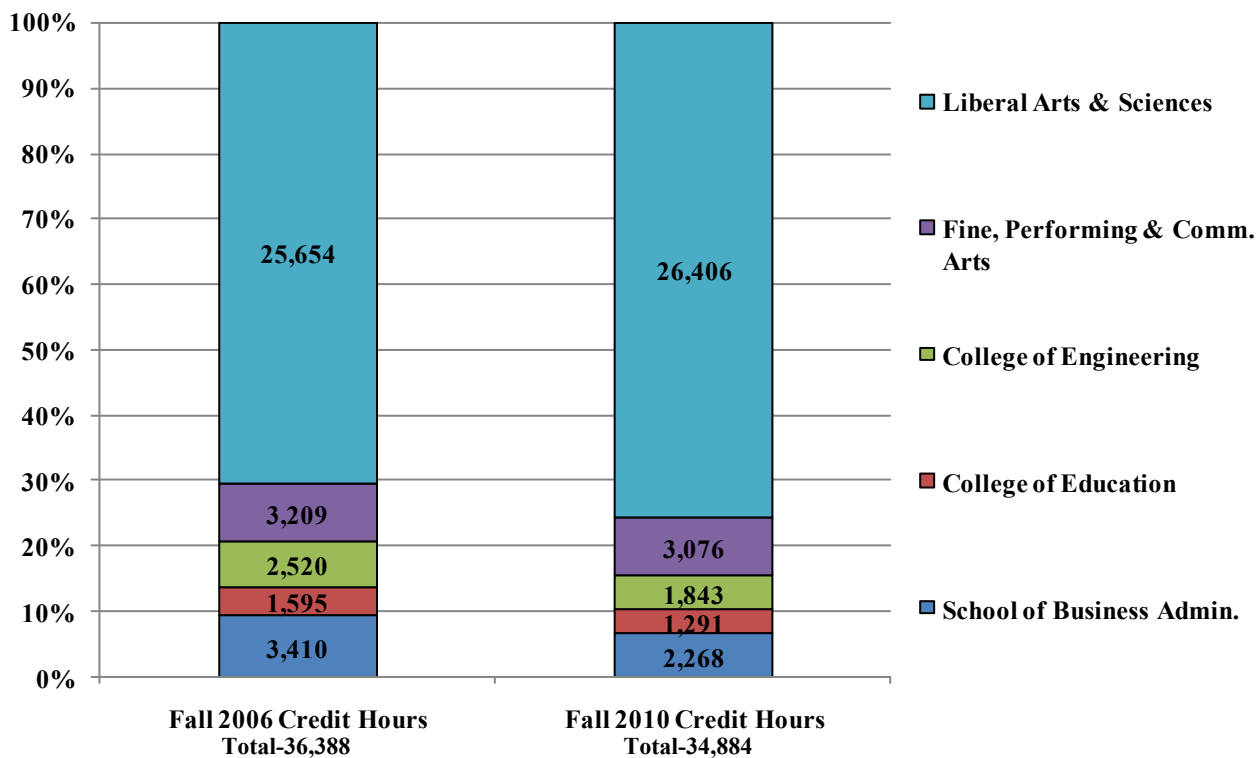

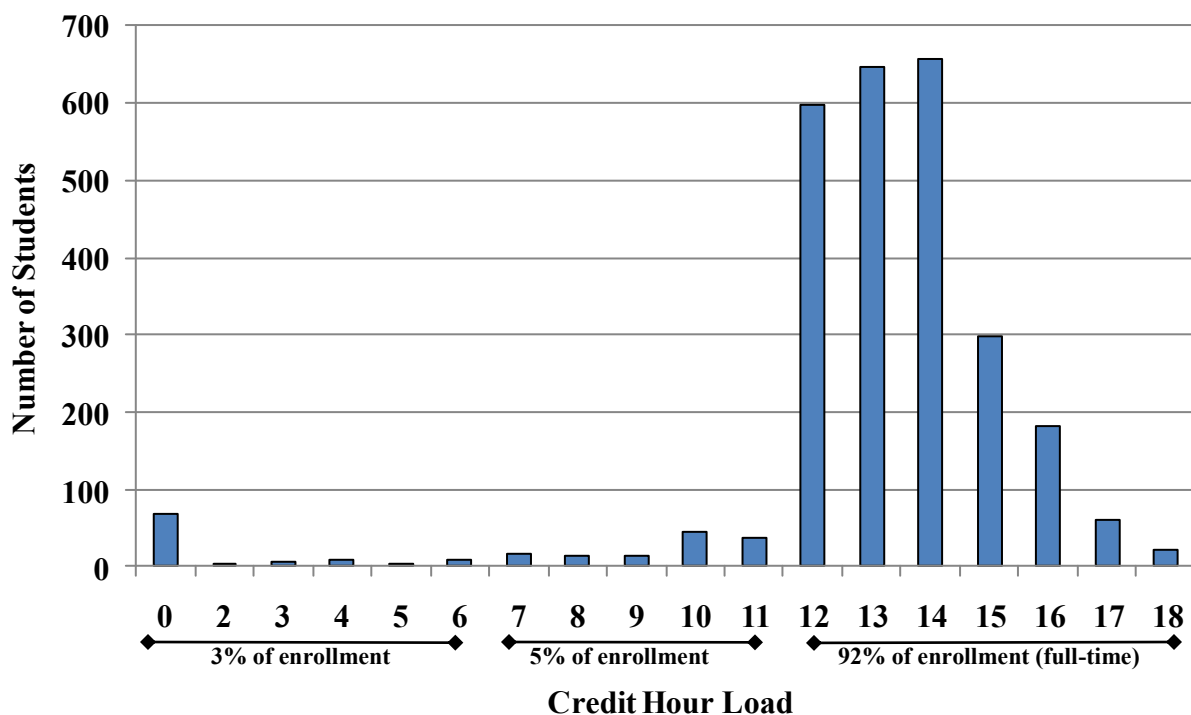

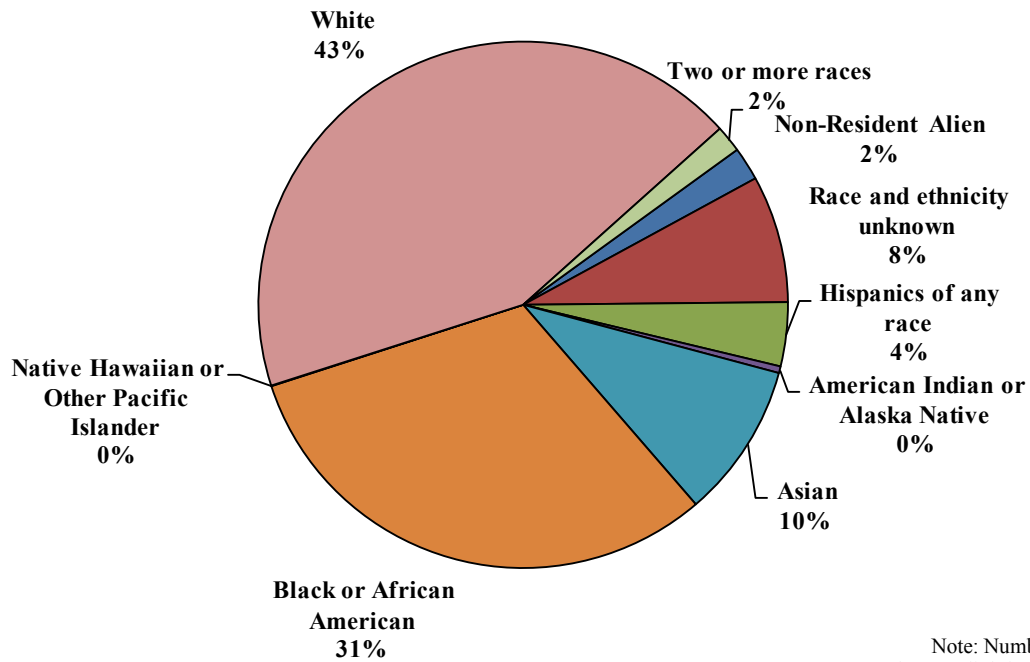
FTIAC Credit Hour Comparison



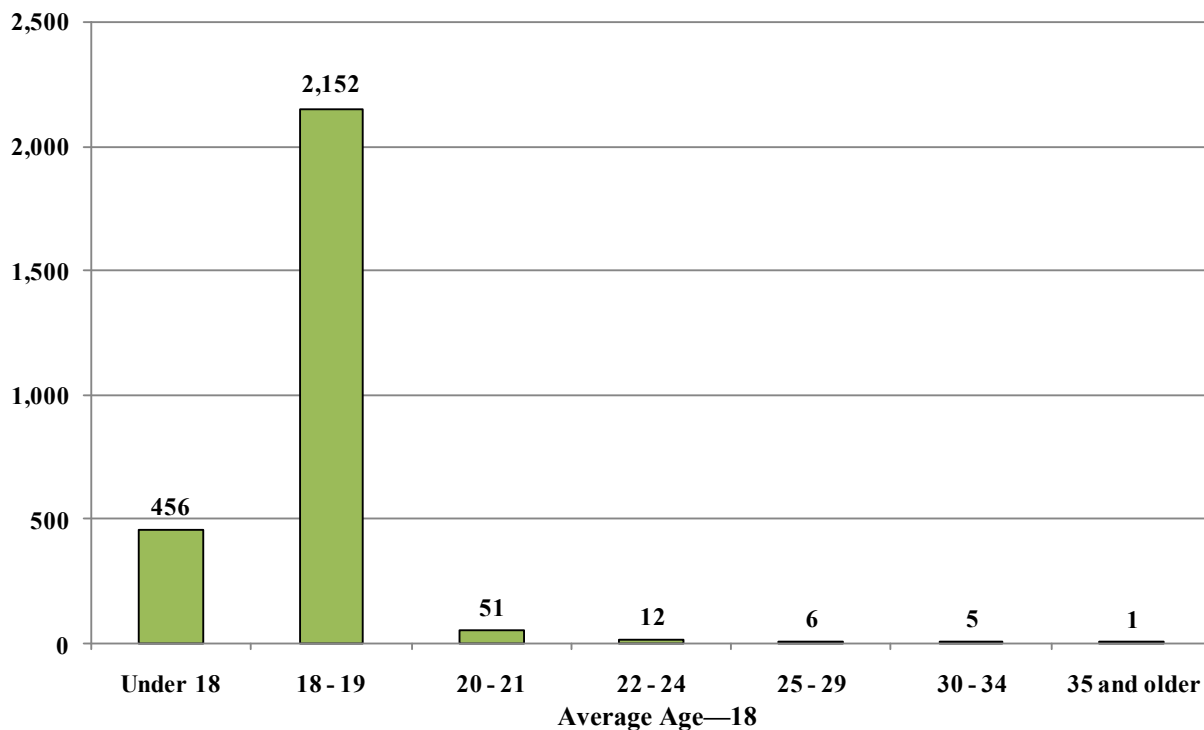
Fall 2010 FTIAC Student Credit Hour Load Distribution



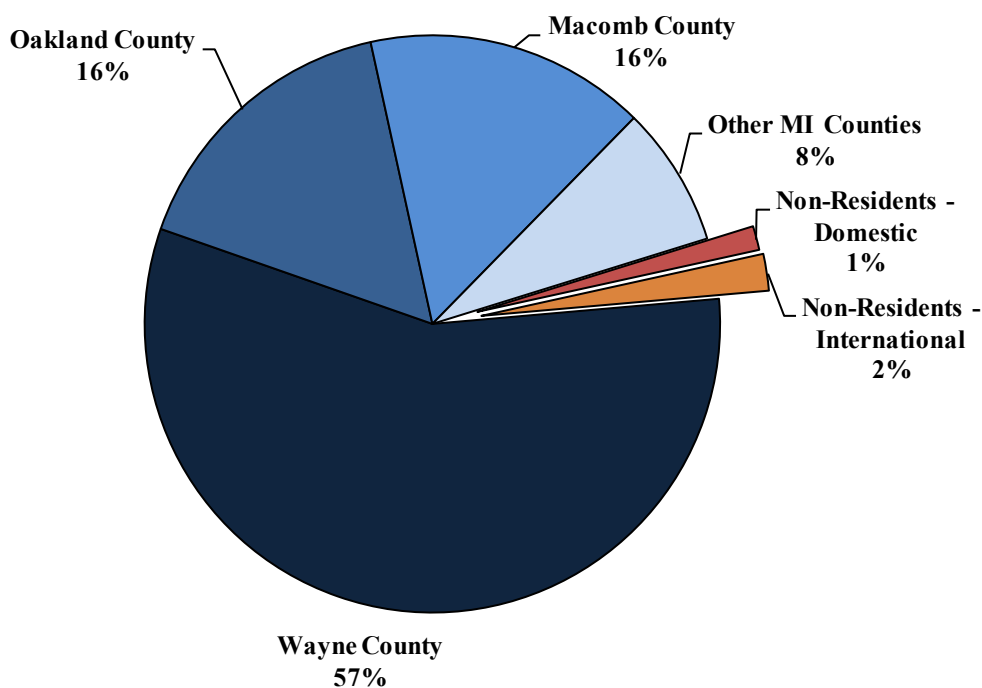
Fall 2010 FTIAC Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity

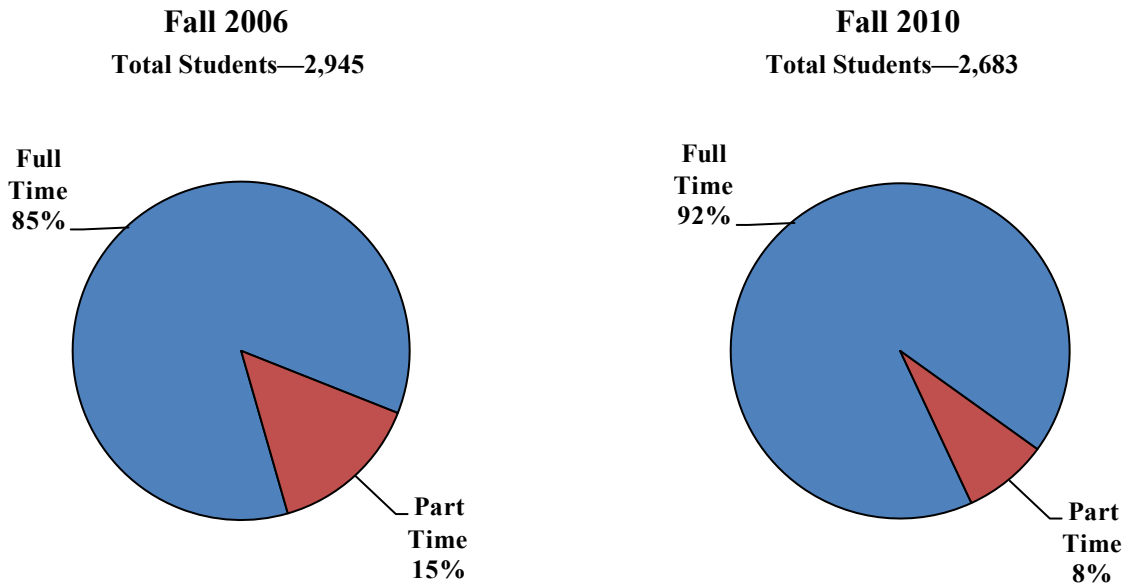

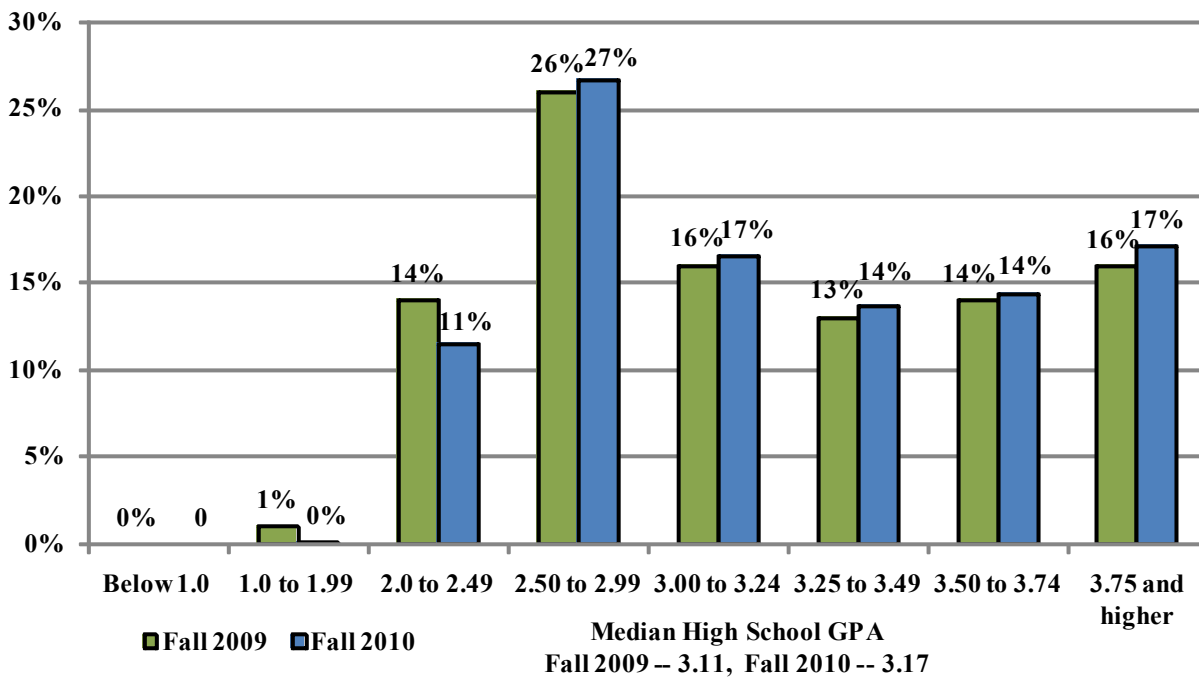

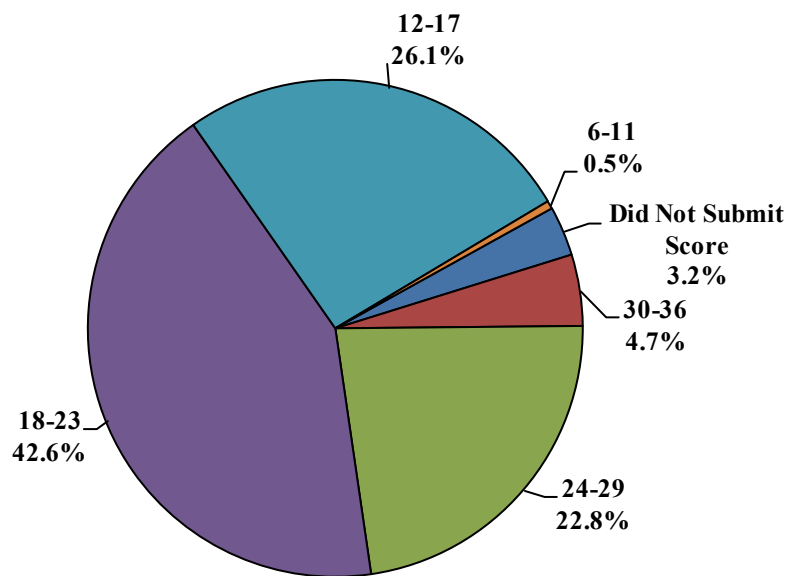
Fall FTIAC Enrollment by Time Status Comparison

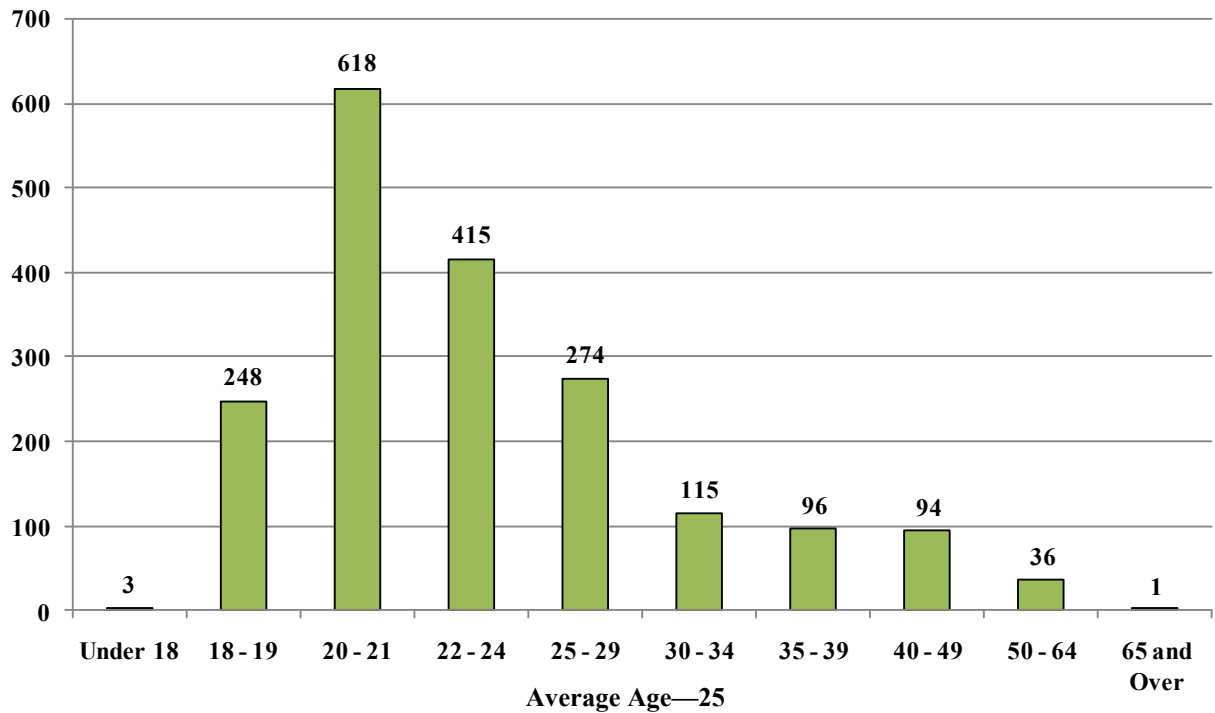

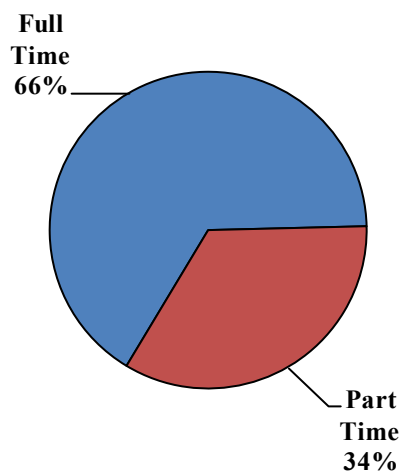
Fall 2010 Transfer Enrollment by Age



Fall Transfer Enrollment by Time Status Comparison

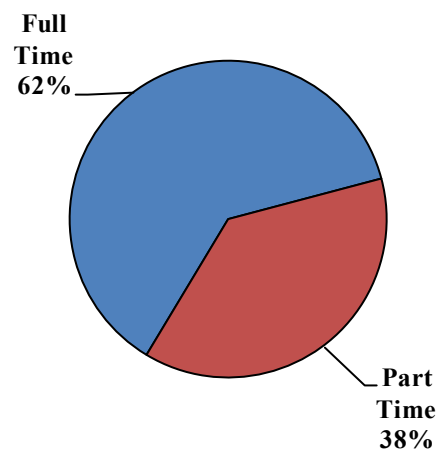

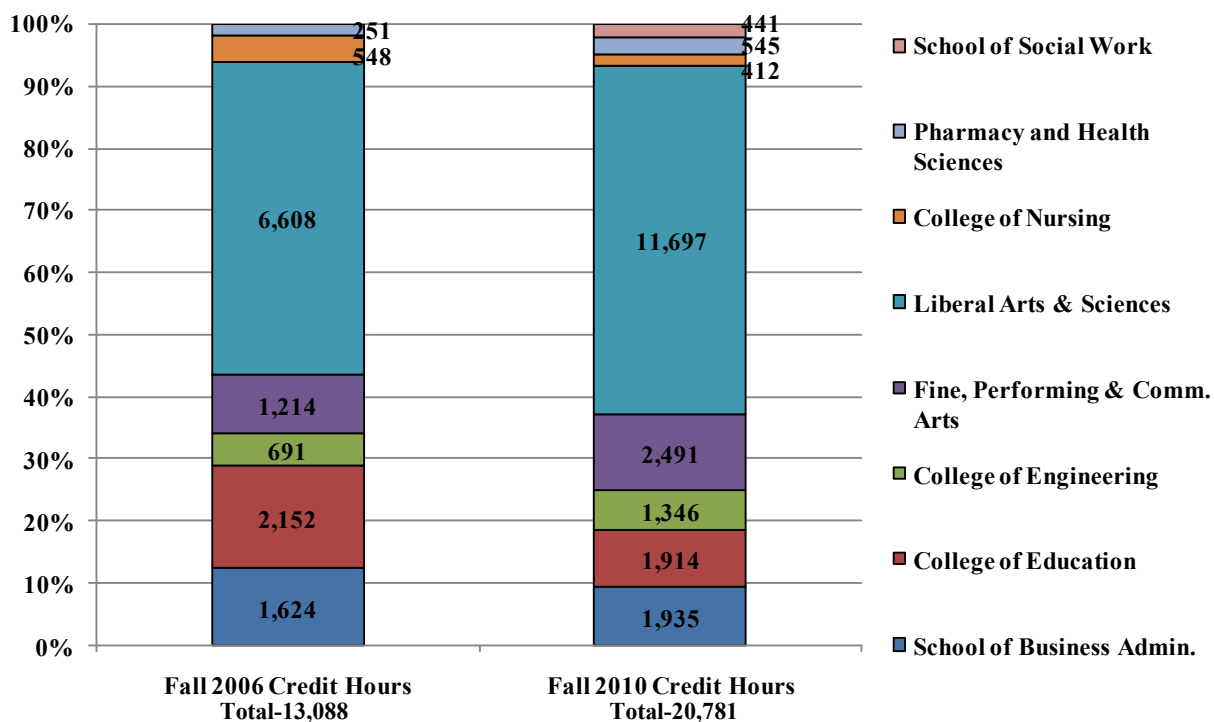

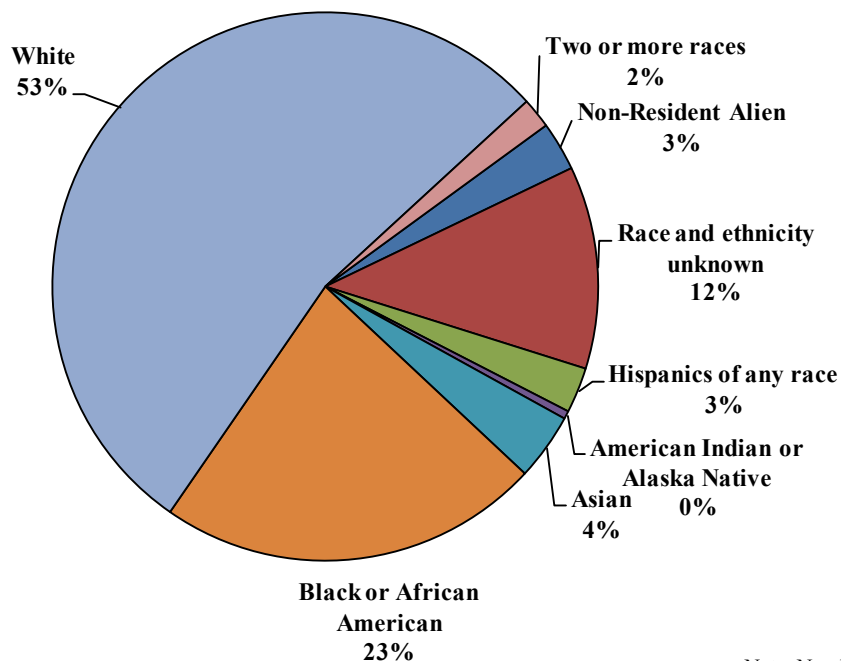

Fall Transfer Credit Hours Comparison



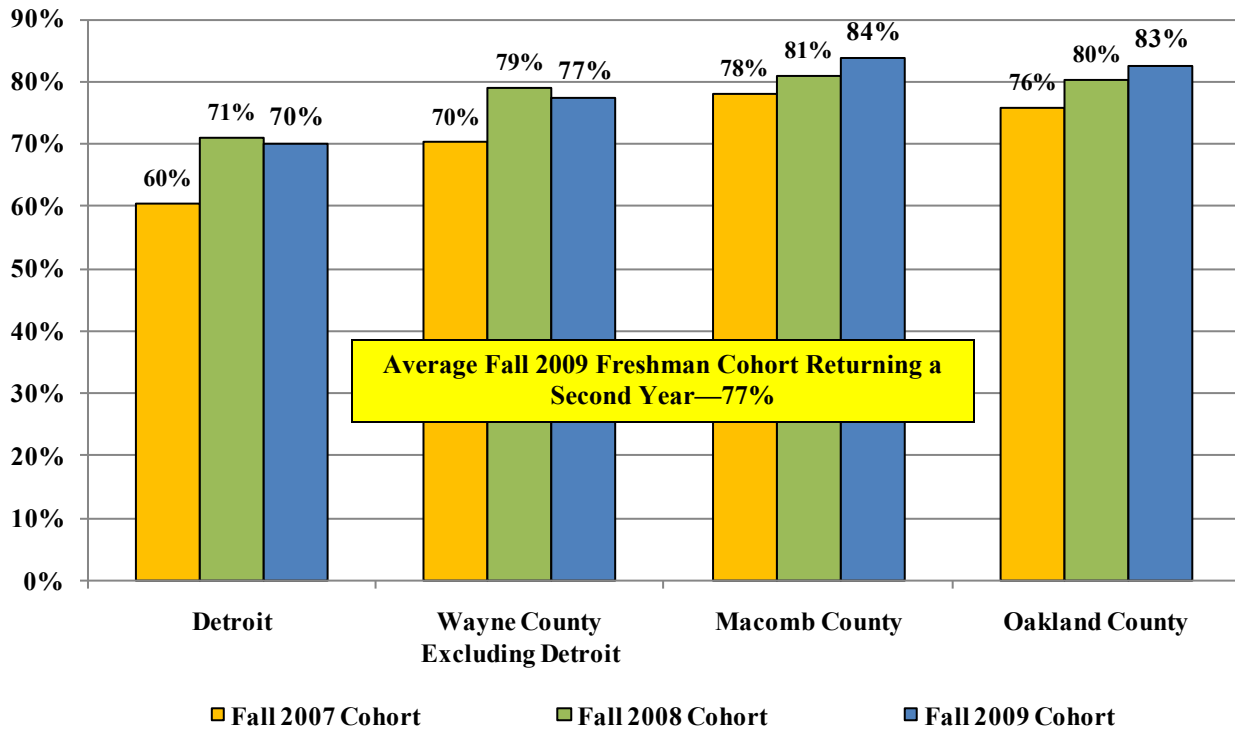
Fall 2010 Transfer Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity



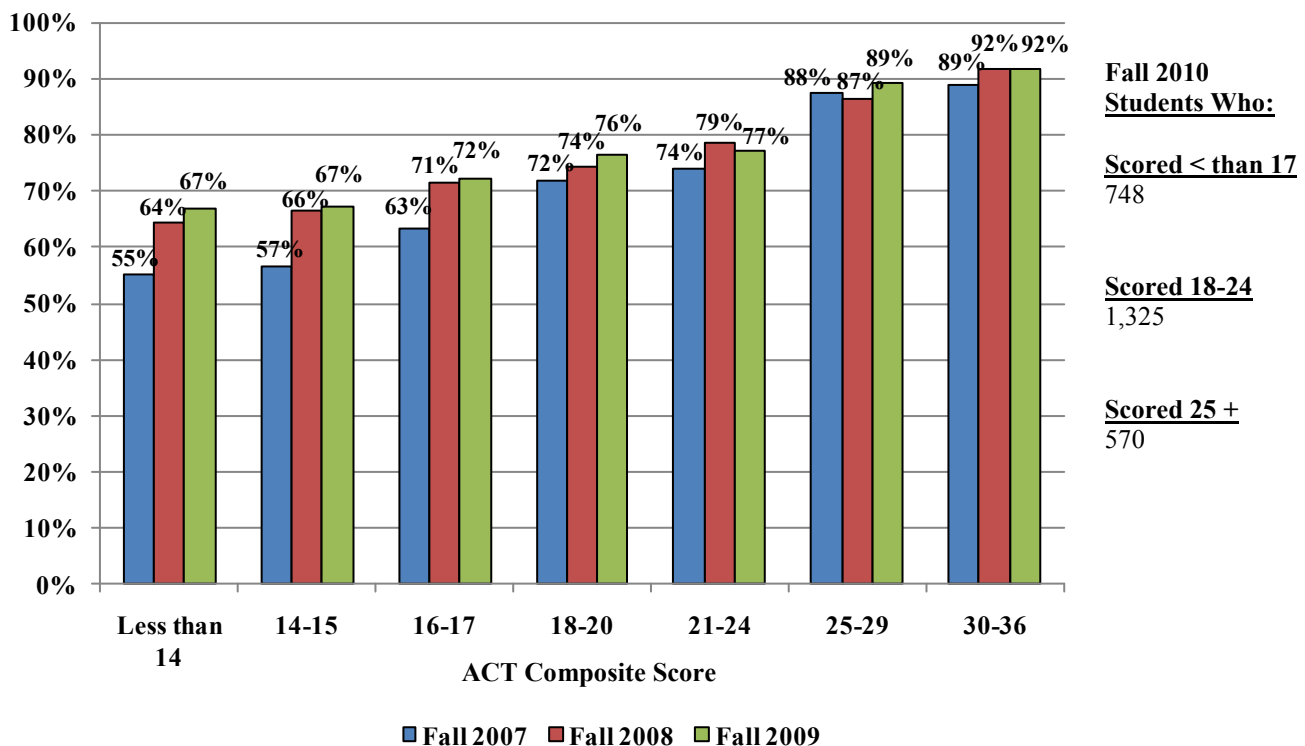

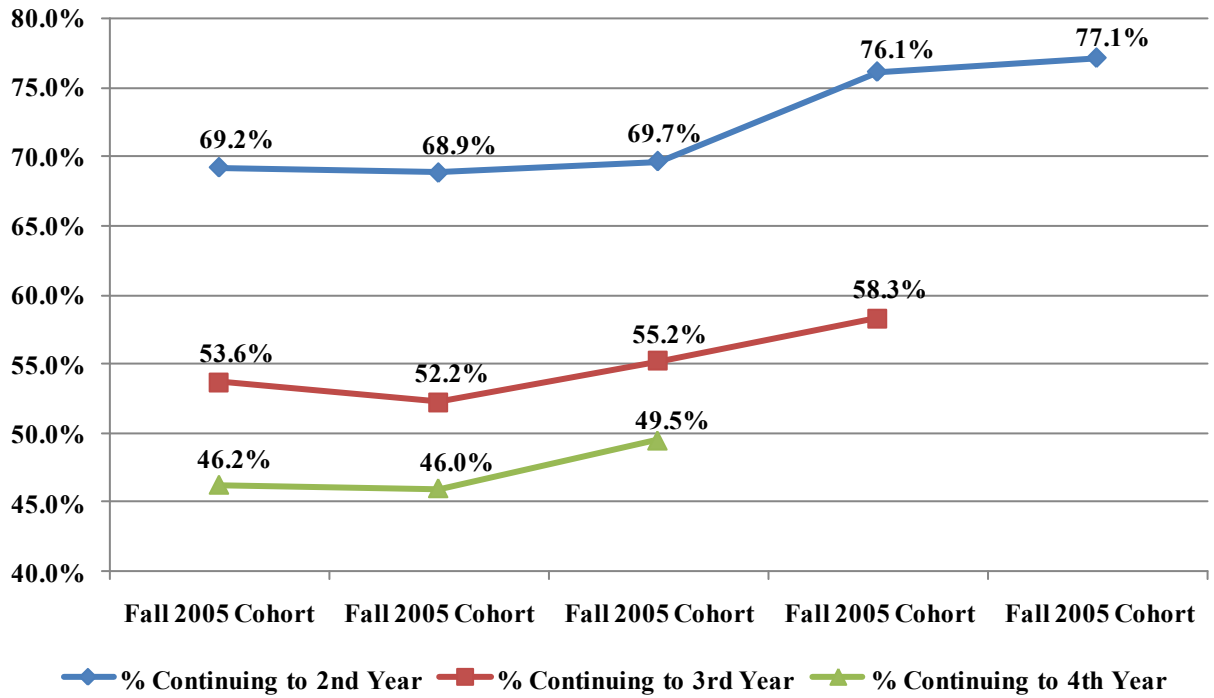
Tri-County Fall Full-time Freshman to Second Year Retention



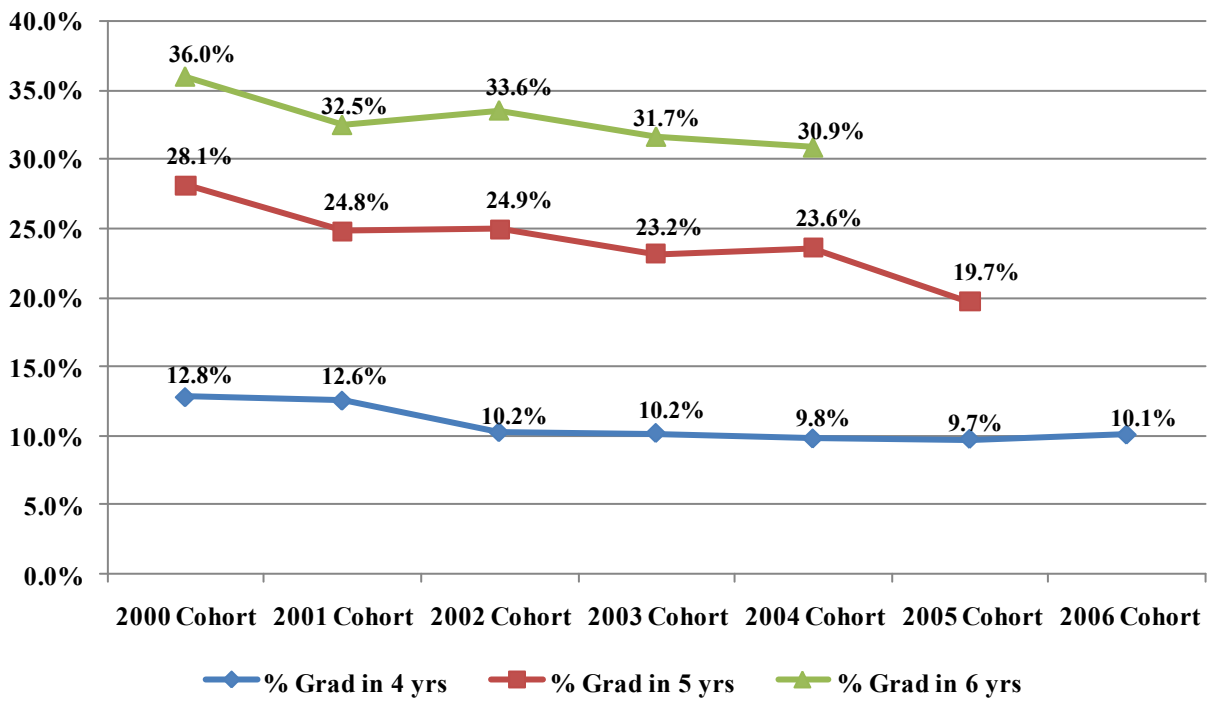
Fall Full-time Freshman to Second Year Retention by ACT Composite Score



Fall Full-time Multi-Year Retention

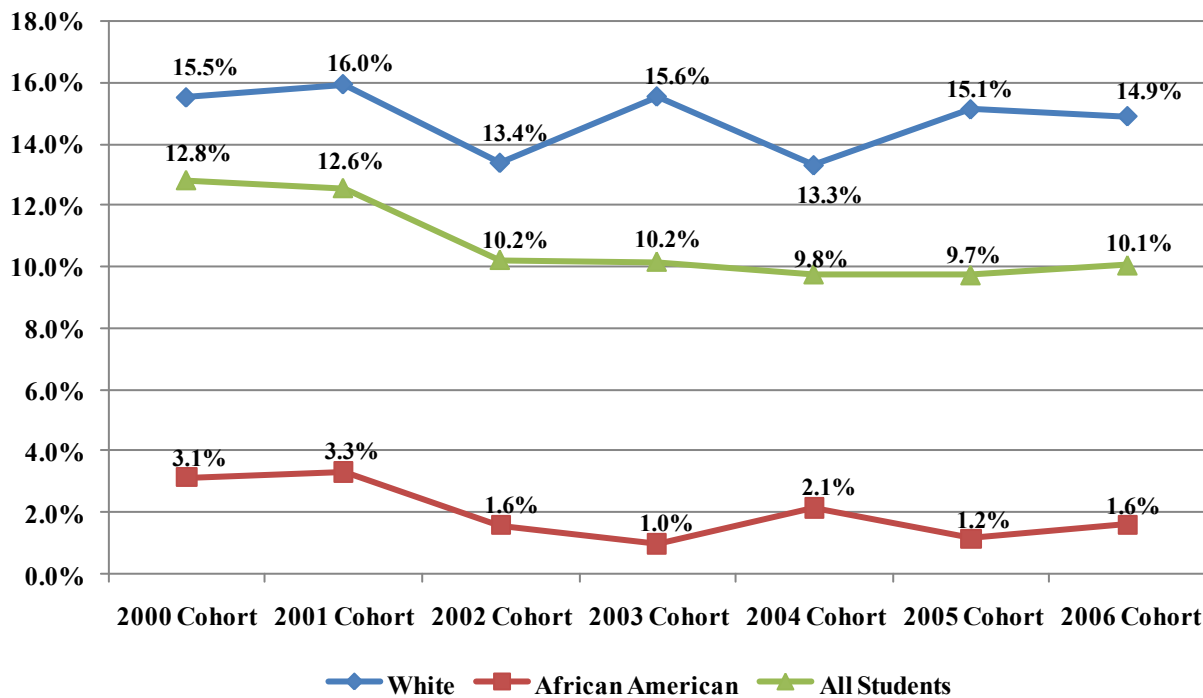


Undergraduate Multi-Year Graduation Rates

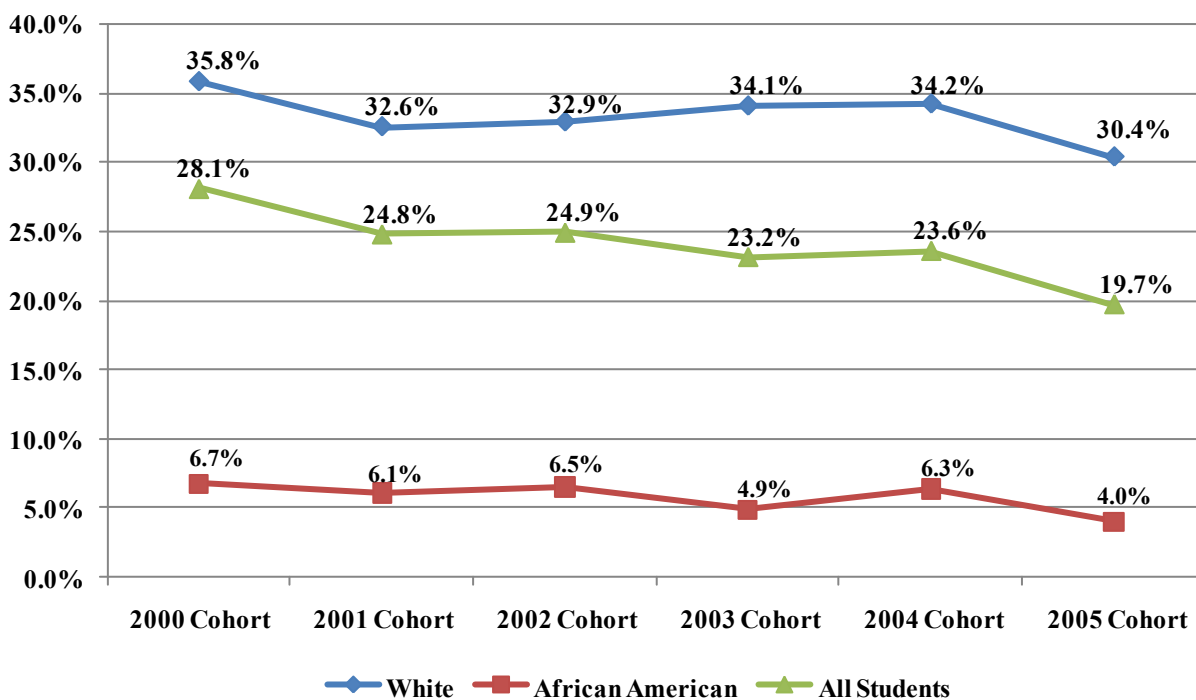

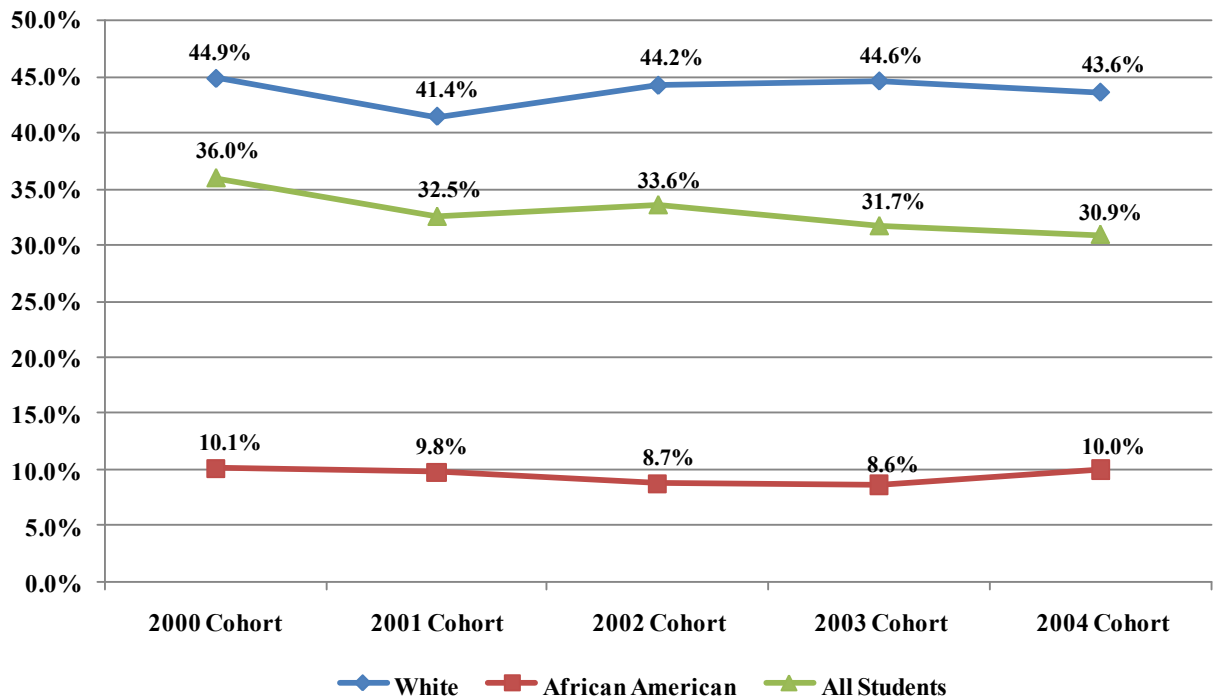
Undergraduate Four-Year Graduation Rates by Race/Ethnicity

Graduate Fall Enrollment

The Graduate level headcount and credit hours for fall 2010 decreased by 4.1 % and 3.1% respectively.

Applications to the graduate schools/colleges decreased 5.7% from the fall of 2009 while total admittances and matriculation dropped 11.8% and 15.2%.

Three schools/colleges posted a positive gain in graduate headcount and credit hours: School of Medicine, College of Nursing, and School of Social Work. School of Social Work had the highest increases of 13.9% in headcount and 14.9% in credit hours.

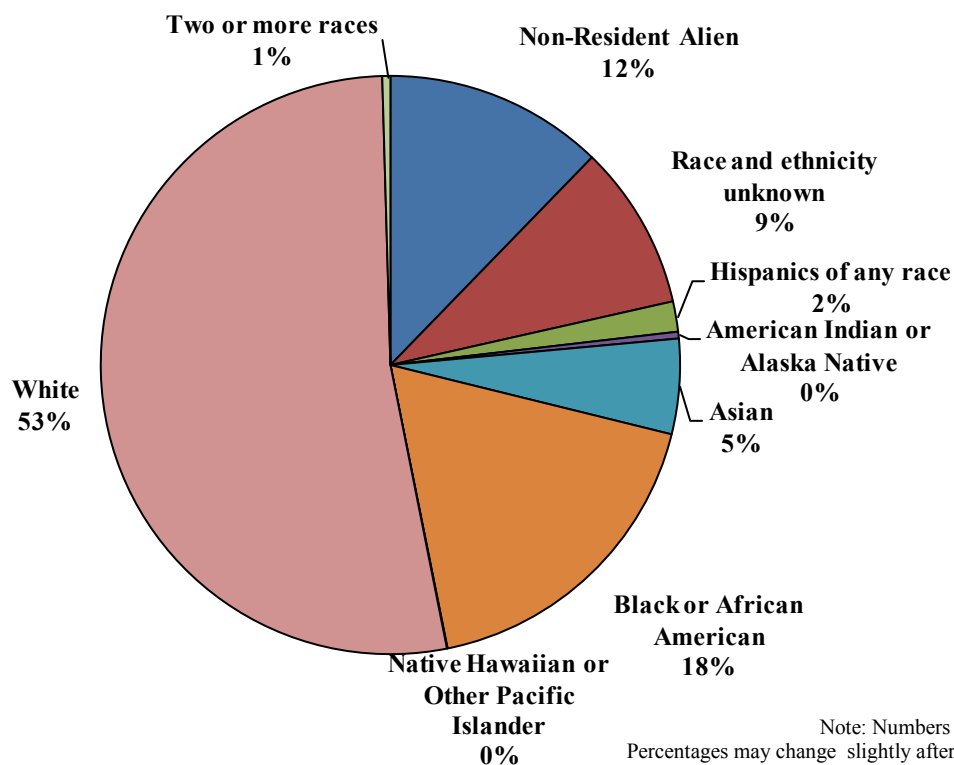

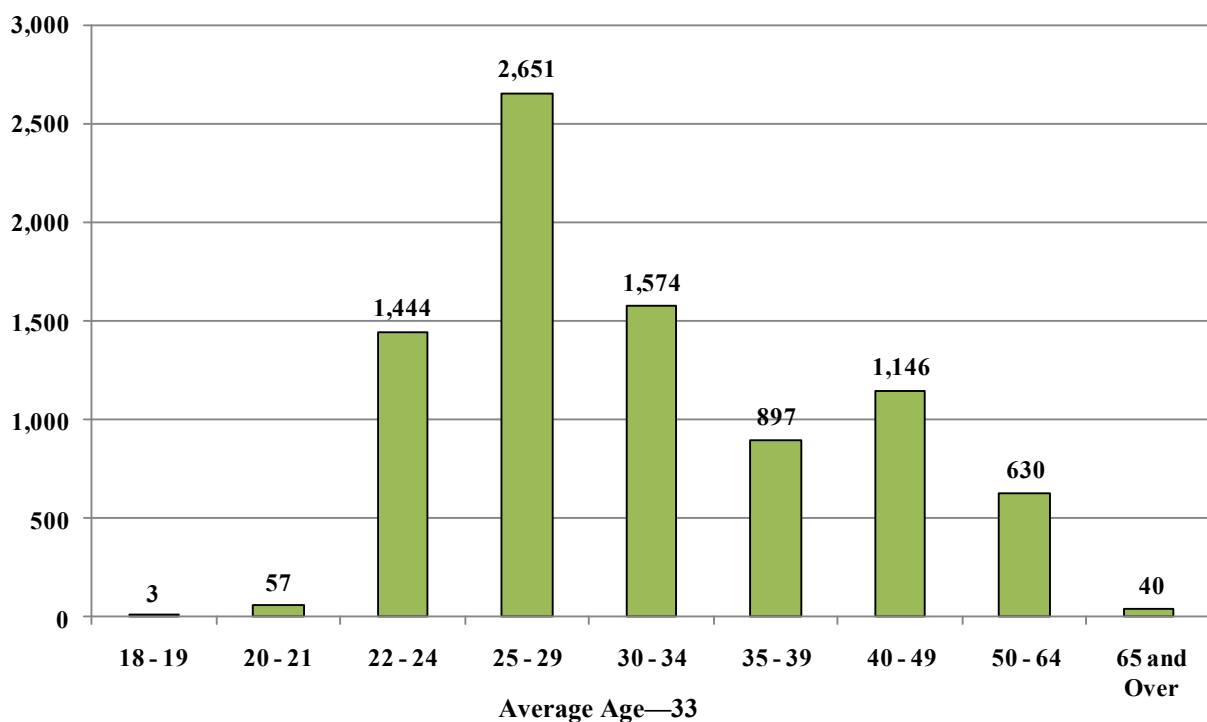

Fall 2010 Graduate Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity

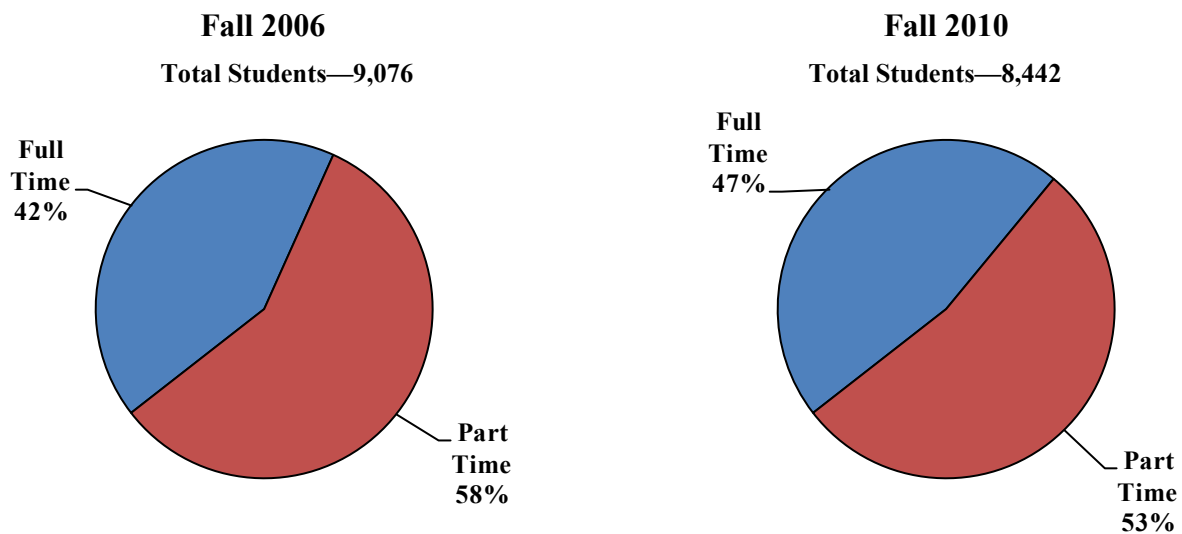


Fall 2010 Graduate Enrollment by Age

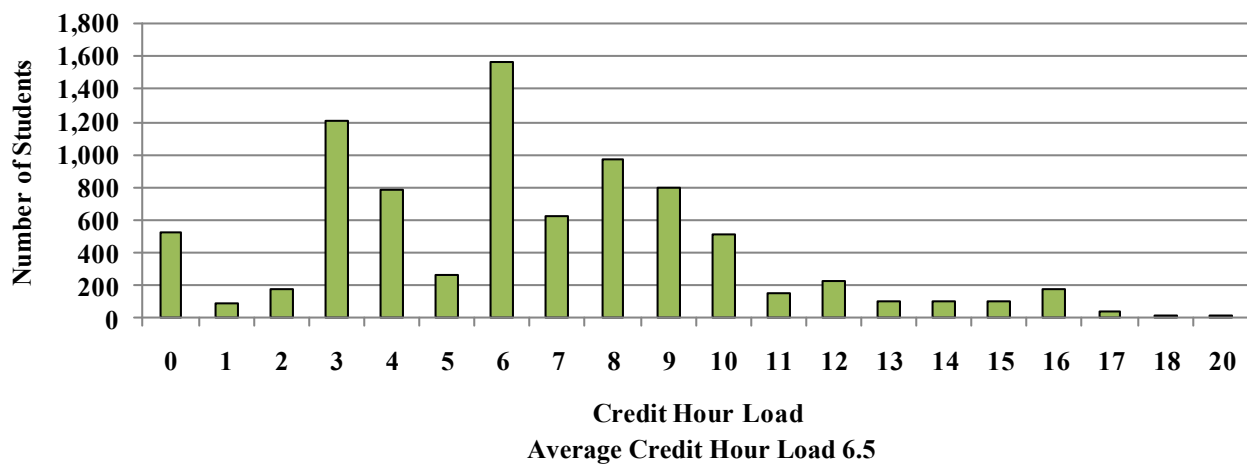
Fall Graduate Enrollment by Time Status Comparison



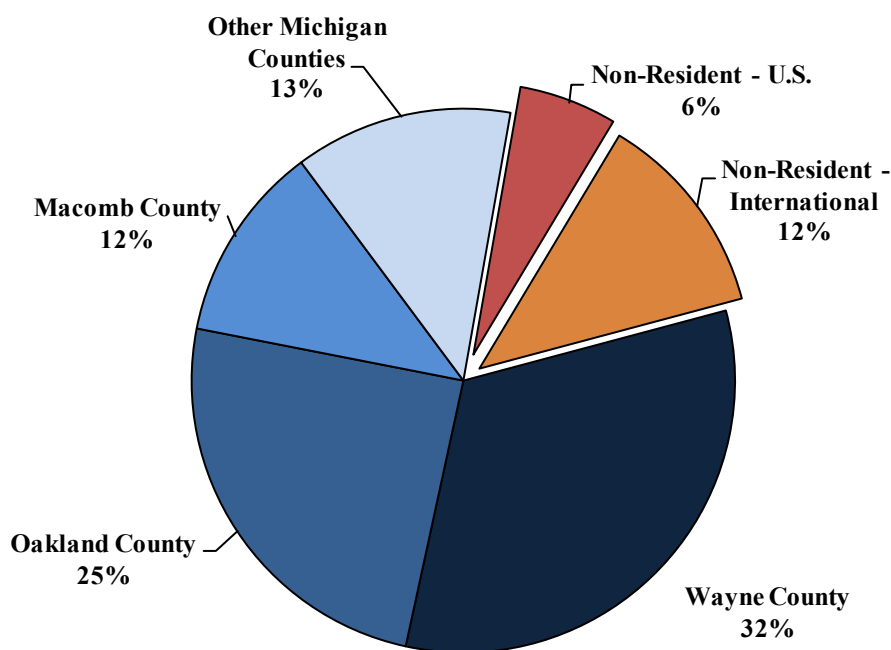

Professional Fall Enrollment

The Professional level headcount increased by 7 students (0.3%) since fall 2009 and credit hours increased by 586 (1.4%).

The only school of professional level students to gain in both enrollment and credit hours was Law School. Medicine increased in credit hours but Pharmacy decreased in both areas.

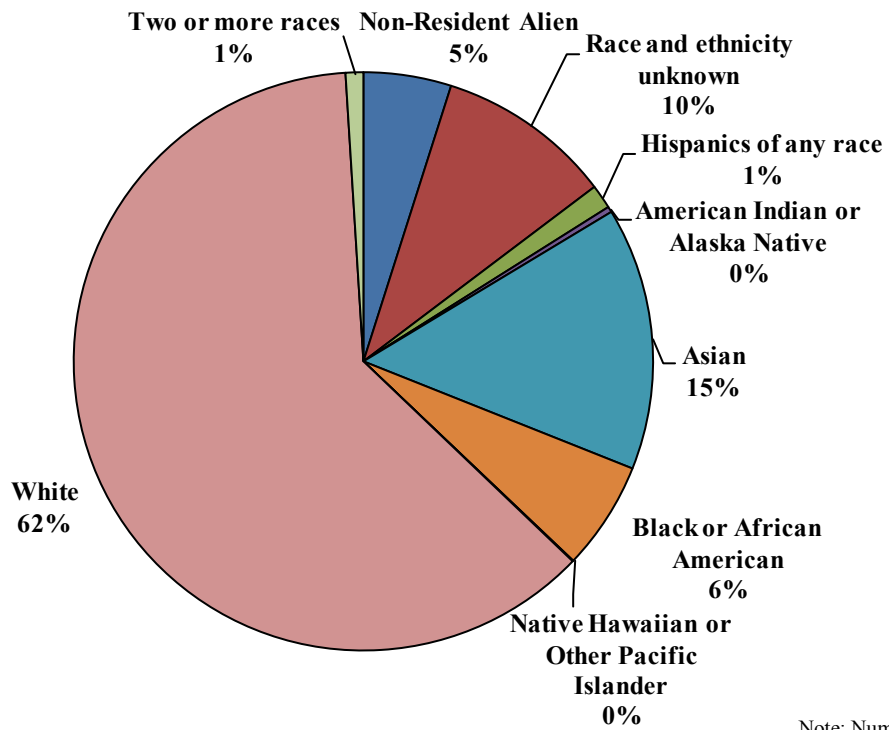

Fall 2010 Professional Student Credit Hour Load

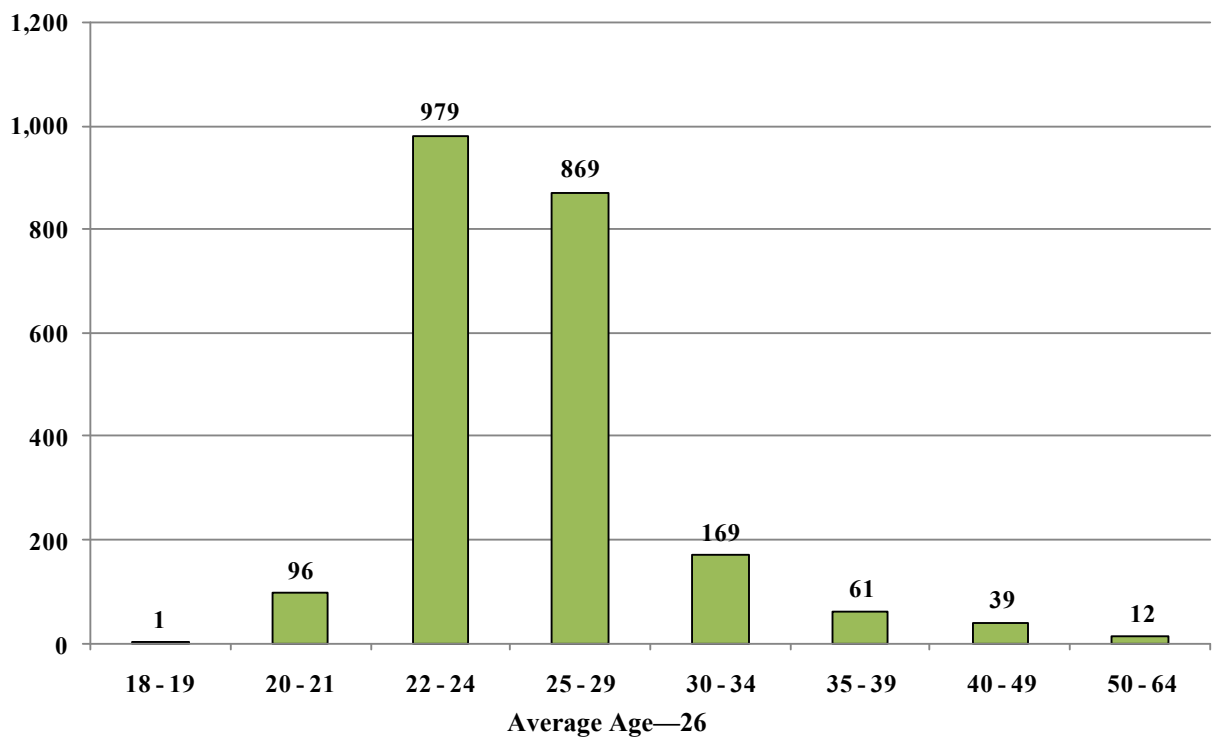

Fall 2010 Professional Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity

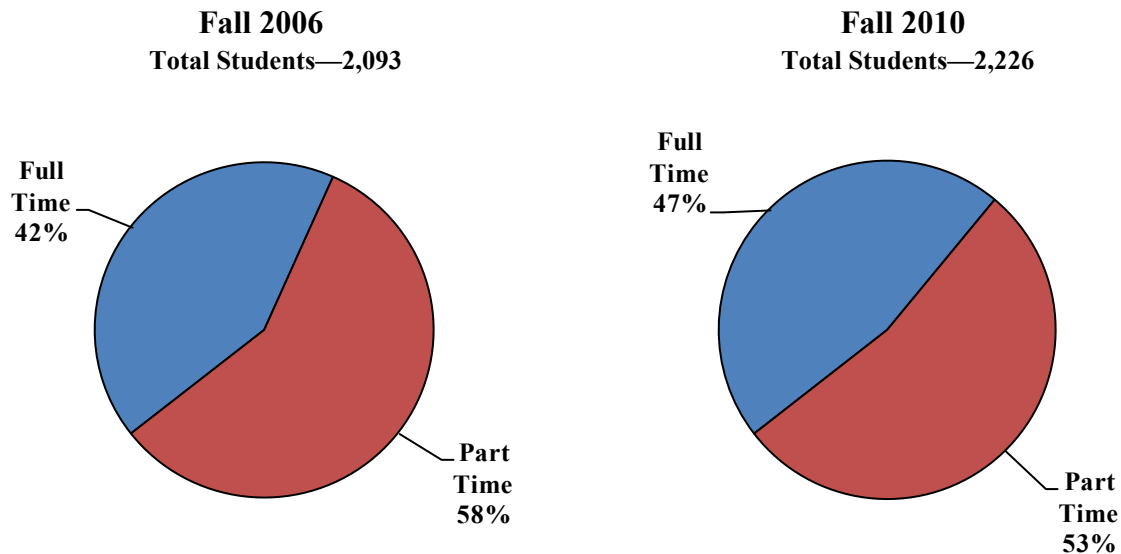

Fall 2010 Professional Enrollment by Age



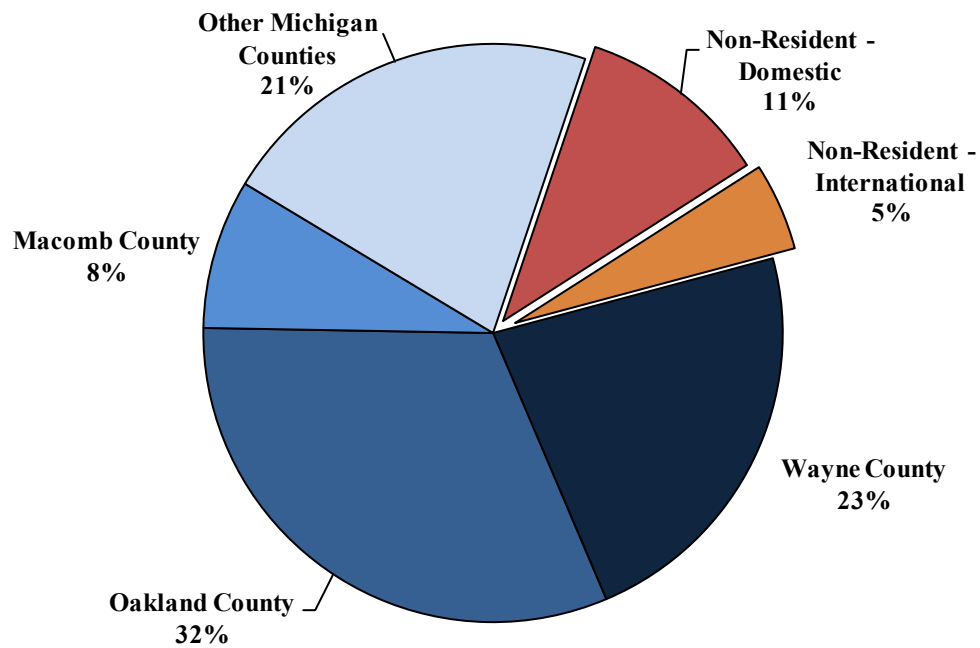
Fall Professional Enrollment by Time Status Comparison
